Story

The young seminarians, including Jean-Claude Colin, aspired to establish a new Society dedicated to Mary, akin to the Society of Jesus. Despite skepticism from church authorities who questioned the need for another Religious order, they placed their trust in Mary, consecrating their mission on the altar and beginning their journey as the Society of Mary.

On July 23, 1816, twelve seminarians, led by Jean-Claude Colin and Jean-Claude Courveille, climbed to the chapel of Fourvière in Lyon, France, filled with excitement, faith, and a touch of




nervousness. After long discussions about their vision—to serve the Church in Mary's spirit of humility and love—they committed themselves to the Marist mission.

As part of the pledge, the names of the twelve were read aloud, symbolizing their dedication:

Although Marcellin Champagnat missed this formal pledge at Fourvière, he remained fully committed to the Marist vision and later became one of its central figures.



This pledge was a powerful commitment to create a Society of Mary—a community of believers, like the eleven apostles and Mary at Pentecost. Their commitment affirmed a life living the Spirit of Mary in the world today as a family.
