The **Marist Way Committee** brings together people from across the **Marist family—lay people, brothers, priests, sisters, and missionary sisters**—to share

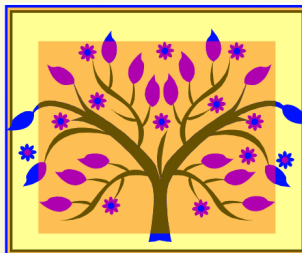
in the mission of Mary and make her spirit known in the world today.

The pilgrimage begins at **9:00 a.m.** in the **Crypt of St Patrick's Church** with a welcome and tour led by **Fr Peter McMurrich SM**, followed by a shared morning tea. From there, pilgrims will travel by bus to **Hunters Hill**, where **Sr Vicki** and **Sr Marg Tisch** will share insights into the **SMSM (Missionary Sisters of the Society of Mary)** story. A light lunch and conversation hosted by the **Hunters Hill Marist Lay Group** will offer pilgrims a glimpse into how local lay Marists live out the charism of Mary today.

The journey continues to **St Joseph's College**, where **Br Peter Rodney** and **Richard Quinn** will lead a presentation on the **Marist Brothers and the Marist Association**, deepening the community's understanding of Marist identity and mission.

Later in the afternoon, the group will travel to **Marist Sisters' College Woolwich**, where a Marist Sister will guide a tour and share the story of the **Marist Sisters (SM)**. A time of **quiet reflection and afternoon tea** will close the day before returning to St Patrick's by **4:45 p.m.**

This pilgrimage offers a unique opportunity to explore the roots and richness of the Marist tradition in Sydney, grounded in the spirit of Mary and alive in the lives of laypeople, sisters, missionary sisters, brothers, and priests alike. One Saturday in March and April students from Mercy College Chatswood and Catherine McAuley Westmead connected via Zoom with girls from the Balay Banaag Girls' Shelter in the Philippines for another inspiring session of **The Other Half** program.



Led by our Australian students, the meetings was filled with laughter, meaningful conversations, and rich cultural exchange. Together, participants played engaging games, shared photos of their favourite holiday destinations, taught each other words in different languages—including Korean, Tagalog, and Chinese—and bonded over discussions about favourite foods. By the end of the night, it was clear that small actions can have a powerful impact on those facing daily challenges.

This initiative is truly unique—no other schools runs a program quite like it. It reflects the **leadership, generosity, and compassion** of our students, who continue to be ambassadors of **connection, service, and global solidarity**.

His latest book, *Murriyang: Song of Time*, offers a path to peace and forgiveness, grounded in the Wiradjuri spiritual practice of deep silence and respect.
